Please be seated for the telling of the Christmas story from Luke's Gospel. As the story is read, children bring their Nativity pieces and place them in the crèche.

First Reading

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town

of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child.

Hymn: Once in Royal David's city (verse 1)

During the singing of the hymn, children place Mary, Joseph, the cow and the donkey in the manger.



Second Reading

While they were there, the time came for Mary to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

Hymn: Once in Royal David's city (verse 2)

During the singing of the hymn, a child places the **Baby Jesus** in the manger.



Third Reading

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see-- I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger."

Hymn: The First Nowell verses 1 & 2

During the singing of the hymn children bring the **large angel**, the **shepherds** and the **non-plush sheep** forward and place them in the manger.



Fourth Reading:

And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest heaven,

and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"

Hymn: Angels We Have Heard on High vs 1 & 2

During the singing of the hymn, children bring the **smaller angels** and place them in the manger.



Fifth Reading:

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us."

So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them.

But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

During the singing of the hymn, children bring the **plush sheep** and **any remaining crèche figures** and place them in the manger.

At God's table, there is food for all who are hungry. If you are seeking God and a deeper knowledge of Jesus Christ, you are welcome to receive Holy Communion. If you are not baptized, and would like to learn more about what this could mean for you please speak to our rector, Nancy. Communion will be distributed at the bottom of the chancel steps. Gluten-free wafers are available. You may sip from the chalice or dip your wafer with careful hands. The alcohol-free chalice will be available in addition to wine on the right-hand side. If you prefer to receive only the bread, simply bypass the chalice and return to your seat. If you prefer not to receive bread or wine at this time, remain seated and join in communion in your heart.

THE HOLY COMMUNION

Come, you who hunger and thirst for a deeper faith, for a better life, for a fairer world. Jesus Christ, who once sat at our human tables now invites us to be guests at his.

- *One:* The Lord be with you.
- *Many:* And also with you.
- *One:* Lift up your hearts.
- *Many:* We lift them to the Lord.
- *One:* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God
- Many: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing to give thanks to you, Creating God. And so, we join our voices with all creation as we shout with joy:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Holy God, we praise you. Let the heavens be joyful and the earth be glad. We bless you for creating the whole world, for your promises to your people Israel, and for Jesus Christ, in whom your fullness dwells.

Born of Mary, he shares our life, Eating with sinners, he welcomes us. Guiding his children, he leads us. Visiting the sick, he heals us. Dying on the cross, he saves us. Risen from the dead, he gives new life. Living with you, he prays for us.

On the night on which he was betrayed, and as they were sitting at a meal, Jesus took a piece of bread and broke it. He gave it to the disciples saying, "This is my body. It is broken for you. Do this to remember me."

Later after they had eaten, Jesus took a cup of wine and said, "This cup is the new relationship with God Made possible because of my death. Drink this all of you, to remember me."

So now we do as Jesus said. With thanksgiving we take this bread and this wine, and we proclaim the death and resurrection of our Lord.

When we are together and share bread and wine like this, Jesus has promised to be present. Loving God, receive our thanks and praise.

Pour out your spirit upon us and upon this meal that it may be the body and blood of our Lord. Make us one with Christ and will all who share this feast.

Unite us in faith, encourage us with hope, inspire us to love, that we may serve as your faithful disciples until we feast at your table in glory.

We praise you, eternal God, through Christ your Word made flesh, in the holy and life-giving Spirit, now and forever. **Amen.**

And now we pray the words that Jesus taught us:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your Name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial, and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and for ever. Amen.

We break this bread to share in the Body of Christ; We who are many are one body for we all share in the one bread.
